SEA-TO-SKY CELL PHONE ALERTS FIRST IN CANADA

VANCOUVER – A first-in-Canada wireless telephone subscription service will immediately alert travellers to unscheduled delays on the Sea-to-Sky Highway, the Ministry of Transportation and the Weather Network announced today.

The Road Alerts service will help travellers plan around unscheduled closures. In the event of an unscheduled closure, text messages will be sent to subscribers' mobile telephones or handhelds.

The messaging system, designed specifically for the Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project, is the first text message based road alert system in Canada.

The Road Alerts service is available on most wireless carriers. Each alert costs \$0.25 and subscribers are billed directly by their service providers.

To subscribe to the Road Alerts service, wireless telephone users can send a text message to "ROADS" (76237) with the text "Sea to Sky" in the body. The Sea-to-Sky text messaging project is one more piece in an integrated information system that includes road and traffic information on the Weather Network television channel, and theweathernetwork.com and metromedia.com websites. Project partner Pelmorex Inc., which owns the Weather Network, plans to extend this system across the country.
