Minimal Delays on Highway 1 (Upper Levels Highway) – June 1, 2006

Within the approved schedule of closures and delays, travellers are advised to expect a delay of no more than 20 minutes on June 1, 2006 at approximately 1:45pm on Highway 1 (Upper Levels Highway) between Exit 4 at Caulfeild Drive and the Eagleridge overpass, Exit 2 after Nelson Creek Bridge. This stoppage will allow construction crews to relocate hydro utilities.

There will be no impact on the Eagleridge underpass or Exit 4 at Caulfeild Drive.

As noted in the Construction Bulletin of April 6, 2006 work has begun on the overland section of the Sea-to-Sky Highway between the Eagleridge Interchange and Larsen Creek. This work is expected to take 24 to 30 months to complete and will include drilling, blasting, clearing, grubbing, earthworks, drainage and roadwork activity. Ongoing lane shifting will continue on Highway 1 (Upper Levels Highway) between Nelson Creek Bridge and Exit #1.

Night time construction work – May 29 through June 30, 2006

West Vancouver residents are reminded of random night time construction work during the hours of 8pm - 6am in the vicinity of the Eagleridge overpass from May 29 to June 30. This work is required to facilitate the lane shifting and the relocation of a water main under the highway. The work is not expected to create delays for travellers, but is required due to the high volumes of traffic during the day.

Reminder of Traffic Management Relating to Highway Improvement Work in the Area

To minimize impacts to the travelling public, delays between the Nelson Creek Bridge and Marine Drive Overpass are scheduled in the lightest traffic periods, and coincide with delay periods to the north for those who travel the Sea-to-Sky Highway.

On the Highway 1 (Upper Levels Highway), between the Nelson Creek Bridge and Marine Drive Overpass, drivers should plan for:

- Delays of up to 30 minutes in the early afternoon, between 1:30 pm and 2:30 pm, Monday to Thursday only.
- Delays of up to 15 minutes overnight, between midnight and 5 am, Monday to Friday.
- On 10 occasions over the next year, a two-hour highway closure on weekday mornings, from 3 am - 5 am.

No traffic interruptions are planned in the peak commuting hours of 6 am - 9 am and 5 pm - 8 pm, and no delays over five minutes are expected:

- On Friday afternoons, weekends or statutory holidays
- During daytime December through February
- During spring break

Traffic control is being coordinated with BC Ferries personnel to avoid lengthy delays as a result of ferry off-loading.

Always allow extra travel time for reduced speed zones and minor delays.
