Crushing operations resume at Brunswick Pit

Construction crews will resume aggregate crushing and washing operations at Brunswick Pit for about one month, starting August 14. Processed materials will be used at the Tunnel Point concrete batch plant.

Noise associated with this type of work is unavoidable; however crews will minimize disruption to neighbouring areas by:

- Crushing rock on the upper bench of the pit, away from the majority of area residences
- Restricting rock crushing to day shift work
- At the wash plant next to the highway, placing generators behind rock berms

Washing operations can proceed at only half the rate of the crushing. To meet the highway construction schedule, washing will be done on both day and night shifts. Day shifts are scheduled from 7 am to 5 pm Monday to Saturday, and night shifts from 7 pm to 5 am Sunday to Friday.

Flag persons will be on duty at Brunswick Pit and Tunnel Point to control truck movements between the two locations. Any traffic delays will be minimal.
