



# The Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project

## CONSTRUCTION BULLETIN

### High Fire Rating in West Vancouver Requires Early Work Shift

High fire ratings, regulated by the Ministry of Forests and Range, require that construction crews currently working on the overland route of the Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project between the Eagleridge Interchange and Larsen Creek move to an early work shift. Effective immediately, and until fire ratings are lowered, crews must work from 4am to 2pm. Once it is safe to do so, construction work will return to regular day shifts, from 7am to 5pm and night shifts from 5pm to 3am. Construction will return to the regular schedule as soon as possible.

The work on the overland section is expected to take 10 months to complete and includes drilling, blasting, clearing, grubbing, earthworks, drainage and roadwork activity. Initial notification of this work was made in earlier Construction Bulletins of March 15 and June 5, 2006.

Drilling and blasting from Eagleridge Bluffs to Black Mountain Trail will continue, with blasting scheduled to occur most days once in the morning and once in the late afternoon.
