Construction Work Begins on Mamquam Bridge

Construction work on the new two-lane Mamquam Bridge is scheduled to begin on or about August 14. This new two-lane bridge for southbound traffic is being built adjacent to the existing bridge, and when complete, will result in a four-lane highway.

The initial bridge work involves the installation of bridge pilings. This work is expected to be completed by October 15 and will have minimal impact on the travelling public. The balance of construction including installation of bridge abutments and pier caps, bridge girders and associated road works will be completed in 2007.

Construction work will take place between 7:00am and 5:00pm. No night work is planned for the initial phases of construction.

The recreational trail under the north side of the bridge will be closed during construction, however the south side trail will remain open. The south shore trail will be closed when crews are preparing to begin work on the southern abutments, and at that time, the north shore trail will be re-opened.
