CONSTRUCTION BULLETIN

August 18, 2006

Highway construction on the overland route moves north from Eagleridge Bluffs

Construction on the overland route of the Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project has moved north from Eagleridge Bluffs to Larsen Creek. Initial tree-clearing is now complete and crews have begun drilling and blasting, which is expected to continue into 2007.

As this work reaches the crest of the hill, construction noise may be audible from Horseshoe Bay Village and east-facing Whytecliff and Gleneagles locations. While noise is unavoidable with this type of construction, crews will make every attempt to reduce the effects on residents in these areas. Some mitigation efforts include:

- Leaving a buffer of trees between construction work and residential areas.
- Minimizing the use of pneumatic drilling equipment, and where possible, using quieter hydraulic drills.
- Monitoring each blast for vibration to ensure blasts are within allowable levels.
