### **Mamquam Blind Channel bridge work begins**

Construction begins on or about January 15 on a new four lane bridge over the Mamquam Blind Channel. Initial work will focus on construction of piers and substructures for the first half of the new bridge, which will be completed this year. Traffic will then be redirected onto the new surface, the existing bridge removed and construction will begin on the second half of the bridge. Completion is scheduled in 2008.

Most work will take place between 7 am and 5 pm, although some night work is required, particularly when crews need to erect girders or work in tidal areas.

Occasional traffic delays will be required for girder placement later this spring and removal of the existing bridge later this year. Watch for traffic pattern changes as work progresses.

#### **NOTICE TO TRAIL USERS**

The trail under the bridge will be closed during construction. A detour route has been established and provides stair access to road surface where signs will direct pedestrians to the nearest pedestrian crossings at Cleveland Avenue or Clarke Street.
