



The Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project

CONSTRUCTION BULLETIN

January 23, 2007

Work begins at Stawamus Chief Park

Construction crews have begun clearing and excavating at the Stawamus Chief parking lot and site of the new pedestrian overpass. Along with the new pedestrian overpass, improvements will include a new parking and viewing area on the west side of the highway. Existing parking areas will be left intact for the summer of 2007.

Normal hours of work will be 7 am to 5 pm, with some night work expected for specific stages of construction. Highway traffic will only be stopped intermittently to allow trucks to access the area. Construction is currently planned as follows:

January to February, 2007 Initial clearing work, geotechnical investigation

Spring to fall, 2007 General excavation

Fall 2007 Rock blasting for pedestrian overpass

October 2007 to May, 2008 Construction of new parking lot

Late Fall 2007 or Spring 2008 Construction of new pedestrian overpass

A map of the parking area, planned construction sequence, including blasting details as they become available, and final area plan will be posted at the park information kiosk. Access to the parking and climbing areas will be maintained throughout the construction period.
