UPDATE

Construction plans change for Lions Bay

Work is resuming between Alberta Creek and M Creek, on a revised schedule and with a new design in the works for the Sea-to-Sky Highway's alignment and supporting walls in the Brunswick Beach area.

The schedule for heavy construction will be carried out from 7 am to midnight, Monday to Saturday. An overnight shift will be required occasionally for utility work, or structural instalments. The reduced hours are expected to increase the duration of work in Lions Bay by about 25%, to 2 ½ years.

Designers are reviewing the highway's alignment above and south of Brunswick Beach to maximize the distance and tree buffer between residences and the highway's supporting structures through the use of retaining walls.

When complete, the improvements through the Lions Bay section will include traffic-calming curves where traffic enters the community and enhanced medians as safety and speed control measures. Improvements to the existing highway interchange include improved sightlines and longer merge-lanes for the northbound off-ramp and southbound on-ramp.
