



# The Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project

## CONSTRUCTION BULLETIN

May 28, 2007

### Construction work continues south of Furry Creek Bridge

Work has resumed in the area of South Creek, where crews are building mechanically stabilized earth (MSE) walls. This construction involves concrete wall fabrication and rock fill placement, in addition to minor upslope blasting for ditch widening. Initial notification of the work was made in the Construction Bulletin issued May 4, 2006.

Crews must complete MSE walls on both day and night shifts for the next few months, as the scope and schedule of construction at times requires night work. Once the walls are built, work will focus on roadbed construction, re-grading and paving. Between Porteau Cove and the southern access to the community work will continue intermittently until project completion in 2009.

Whenever possible, crews will perform major construction during the day in consideration of neighbouring residents. In the event of construction-related noise concerns, please contact the construction site office at 604-629-8282.
