CONSTRUCTION BULLETIN

August 27, 2007

Work begins at Stawamus Bridge and surrounding area

Construction is expected to begin at the Stawamus Bridge and surrounding area for the Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project the week of August 27. Initial work includes tree clearing, removal of stumps and placing rip rap (rock or other material used to shield stream banks against water erosion) along the banks of the Stawamus River. This work begins 300 meters south of the Stawamus River and continues to 300 meters north of the river.

Following initial preparation, roadworks and construction of a new bridge over the Stawamus River will take place. The existing bridge will remain in place carrying north and south-bound traffic while the new structure is built to carry two southbound lanes. Crews will then route all traffic over the new structure while they replace the existing bridge to carry northbound traffic.

Hours of work are 7am – 5pm Monday to Saturday. Night work will be limited. When complete in the fall of 2008, the improvements through this area will include four-lanes with median barrier and improved intersections. This work will have minimal impact on the traveling public.
