CONSTRUCTION UPDATE Fall work through Lions Bay

Work continues on the Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project through Lions Bay. Hours of work remain 7 am to midnight Monday to Saturday. Not all Saturday evening shifts will be required for construction. Overnight shifts will be required very occasionally for utility work or girder placement.

Work will continue as follows:

- The northbound median barrier in central Lions Bay has been removed to allow traffic to flow unimpeded as construction staging advances. This will create improved access to Lions Bay during construction.
- In the Kelvin Grove area, construction plans have been revised to no longer require the use of Tidewater Way as a detour for highway traffic. The first traffic pattern change in this area is expected in September/October. A notice will be distributed in advance.
- In the Brunswick area northbound traffic will be shifted west onto what will become the mini-change's northbound off-ramp. When that takes place, space will be left for northbound turns into the Brunswick community.
- Work at Brunswick Pit will continue with the current 'wash pit' being replaced with crushing operations. This is required to crush the 85,000 cubic metres of material excavated north of Lions Bay and used for new construction.
- A traffic control person will be posted at the top of the Brunswick community road while trucking operations are underway to help residents safely access the area.

When complete, improvements through the Lions Bay section will include traffic-calming curves where traffic enters the community and enhanced medians as safety and speed control measures.
