Night girder installation temporarily closes Mamquam Blind Channel Bridge

Crews will begin work on September 17 to install girders on the new Mamquam Blind Channel Bridge. This will require night work beginning September 17 as the first of the girders are moved to the site, with installation taking place over the following three days.

The existing bridge will be closed September 18 and 20, between the hours of 12:01 am and 2 am, as well as 3 am to 5 am both days. The bridge will be open to single-lane traffic between 2 am and 3 am. Cranes will be positioned on the bridge and the new girders will be set in place during the closure periods on these days. An emergency response plan is in place to ensure that emergency vehicles and personnel can cross if needed.

While occasional night work is unavoidable, every attempt will be made to minimize noise and other disruptions to reduce the impact on neighbouring residents and businesses. If you have any questions on construction activity please call 604-629-8283.

NOTICE TO TRAIL USERS

The trail under the bridge remains closed during construction. A detour route has been established and provides stair access to road surface where signs will direct pedestrians to the nearest pedestrian crossings at Cleveland Avenue or Clarke Street.
