Sea-to-Sky Highway improvements on schedule through 2008 Project thanks community for patience

As major highway work continues in 2008, the Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project team thanks Lions Bay and Kelvin Grove residents, employers and staff for their patience during the construction. Noise and disruption are unavoidable with construction of this magnitude, and while crews make every effort to minimize disruption, we recognize and appreciate the community's understanding as blasting, machinery and traffic pattern changes continue.

Kelvin Grove to Lions Bay

- South of Kelvin Grove work continues as crews build retaining walls below the highway and utility services are relocated. Phase 1 of the traffic shift, moving traffic to the 'downslope' section, will take place within the next several months.
- North of Kelvin Grove, work continues through the fall of 2008 on construction of retaining walls below the highway. Excavation will begin on the mountain side of the highway and construction will follow to construct split-grade retaining walls.
- Construction in 2008 will include some blasting as crews lower the roadbed to construct the split-grade configuration. The amount of blasting required will be determined as the excavation proceeds. Construction of the split-grade highway, separating north and south-bound traffic continues until the spring of 2009.
- A traffic lane shift will be required in the fall of 2008, when traffic will be moved to the upslope side.

Brunswick Pit area

- Rock crushing will continue at Brunswick Pit until spring 2008.
- Spring 2008 will see roadwork begin in the Brunswick area. This will allow traffic to be shifted to the mountain side lanes and work to begin on the Brunswick Interchange in early summer 2008
