Sea-to-Sky Highway improvements on schedule through 2008 Project thanks community for patience

As major highway work continues in 2008, the Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project team thanks West Vancouver residents, employers and staff for their patience during the construction. Noise and disruption are unavoidable with construction of this magnitude, and while crews make every effort to minimize disruption, we recognize and appreciate the community's understanding as blasting, machinery and traffic pattern changes continue.

- Work is on schedule, and construction will continue through 2008 as crews build the new Eagleridge interchange and the North Junction just north of Horseshoe Bay to connect the overland route to the Sea-to-Sky Highway. These new interchanges will safely separate through traffic and local travel to and from residential areas such as Pasco Road, Horseshoe Bay Village and the BC Ferry Terminal.
- Work at the Eagleridge Interchange will include a "lane-shift" traffic pattern change on the Upper Levels Highway during the summer. Intermittent blasting will be required through the spring and summer.
- At the North Junction, completion of the new northbound overpass from the "old" highway is expected during fall 2008.
- Construction in 2008 will include continuation of blasting north of Horseshoe Bay. This includes night blasting following a similar schedule as the past year. Each blast is calculated and monitored, and within allowable limits. The blasting schedule will be reviewed in late spring.
- Other work includes rock removal, construction of retaining walls and supporting structures, as well as roadwork.
- Between the North Junction and Ansell Place, retaining wall construction as well as grading and paving will take place.
