Mamquam River Bridge: pedestrian overpass to be removed and temporary cross-walk installed at Centennial Way intersection

The current pedestrian overpass at Centennial Way will be removed on or after February 20 2008. To ensure pedestrian safety and convenience, a temporary pedestrian-activated crosswalk will be placed at the Centennial Way intersection, as illustrated on reverse.

Removal of the current overpass will allow for the construction of the permanent vehicle and pedestrian underpass, to be located south of the Mamquam River Bridge.

For pedestrian safety, the following measures will be implemented at the same time as the cross-walk:

- a speed limit reduction, from 50km/h to 30km/h, from south of the Centennial Way intersection through to the north-end of the Mamquam River Bridge
- advisory signage: including speed limit and crosswalk signage
- pedestrian crossing signs with push-button activated flashing amber lights
- speed reader boards on both northbound and southbound directions

Please follow signs, drive within the 30km/h construction speed limit and be aware of this new pedestrian crossing when driving in this area.
