CONSTRUCTION BULLETIN

North Junction construction requires traffic pattern change: Pasco Road to Snake Hill and Highway 1

Construction at the North Junction, located 3 km north of Horseshoe Bay requires a traffic pattern change, as crews work to join the overland route to Highway 99. This change will be made in two phases, and signage advising of this traffic pattern change will be installed both north and southbound.

Phase 1: on or after May 26 (southbound traffic)

Southbound traffic will be shifted from the current highway to the newly constructed lower road just south of Pasco Road. Southbound traffic will re-join the current highway at Snake Hill, just north of Horseshoe Bay. Northbound traffic is unchanged, and will remain on the current highway.

Phase 2: on or after June 16 (northbound traffic)

At this time, northbound vehicle traffic will also be re-directed to the new lower road from Snake Hill to south of Pasco Road. Moving traffic onto the lower road will allow crews to link the overland route to the highway at Snake Hill. Both north and southbound traffic will remain on this lower road until the overland route is completed in May 2009.

This new North Junction will safely separate through traffic and local traffic to and from the residential areas of Pasco Road and Horseshoe Bay Village.
