North Junction construction requires temporary left-turn restrictions to access Pasco Road

To All Pasco Residents:

As part of the construction at the North Junction where crews are working to join the overland route to Highway 99, the next phase of the Pasco Road construction will commence on or about June 6th. These left-turn restrictions will be in effect until the next phase of the traffic pattern shift at the North Junction. These restrictions will end when northbound Highway 99 traffic is re-directed to the new lower road.

The old Pasco Road access to and from Highway 99 will be decommissioned. The new Pasco Road intersection will be open, but with the following restrictions:

- There are no left-hand turns from Highway 99 northbound to Pasco Road. There are no left-hand turns from Pasco Road onto Highway 99 northbound.
- Residents traveling north from Pasco Road will be required to turn right towards Horseshoe Bay and use the Eagleridge interchange (Exit 2) to turn around to head north.
- Those traveling north from Horseshoe Bay, wanting to access Pasco Road, will need to continue to Ansell Place, turn around on the overpass, and return on the highway to reach Pasco Road.

Emergency response and other service providers such as postal and garbage collection have been notified of this temporary change of access.
