

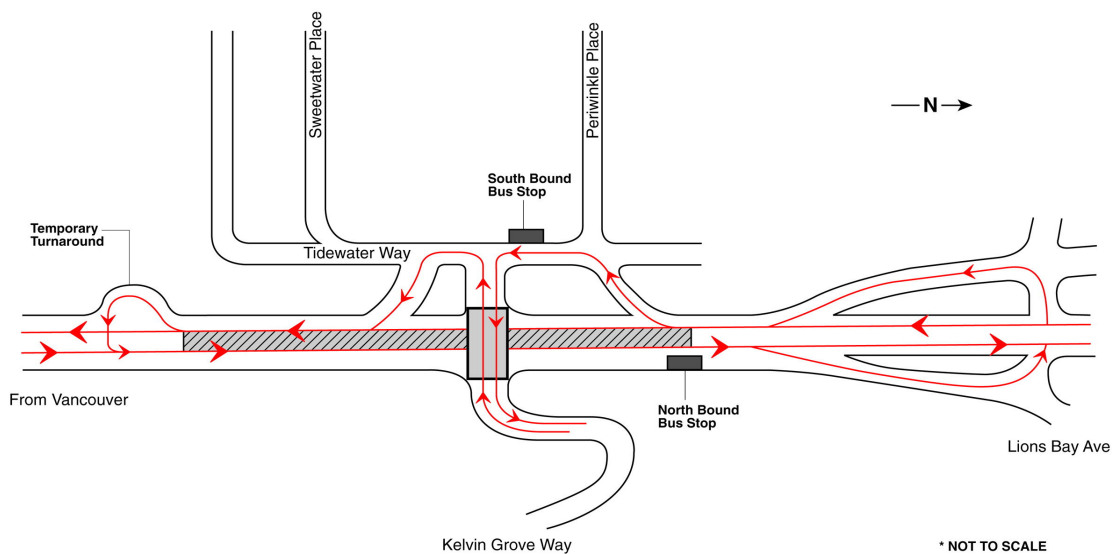

Temporary traffic pattern change impacts access for northbound Kelvin Grove residents

Crews will open the new Kelvin Grove overpass to two-way traffic the week of August 25th. This will require a temporary traffic pattern change for residents of Kelvin Grove. This temporary traffic pattern change will be in effect for approximately 2 ½ months

Northbound access from Highway 99 to Kelvin Grove will be achieved by driving north to the Lions Bay exit, turning under Highway 99 and returning on the southbound lanes to the Tidewater Way exit. Traffic from Kelvin Grove will utilize the new Kelvin Grove overpass to access Highway 99 southbound. The pedestrian-only crossing near Kelvin Grove has been decommissioned, and pedestrian access across the highway is now via the south side of the new Kelvin Grove overpass.



Work continues on the Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project through Lions Bay. Hours of work remain 7 am to midnight Monday to Saturday. Not all Saturday evening shifts will be required for construction. Overnight shifts will be required very occasionally for utility work or girder placement. **If you have any questions regarding construction-related activities please call 604-629-8282**

When complete, improvements through the Lions Bay section will include traffic-calming curves where traffic enters the community and enhanced medians as safety and speed control measures. Improvements to the existing highway interchange include improved sightlines and longer merge-lanes from the northbound off-ramp and south-bound on-ramp.
