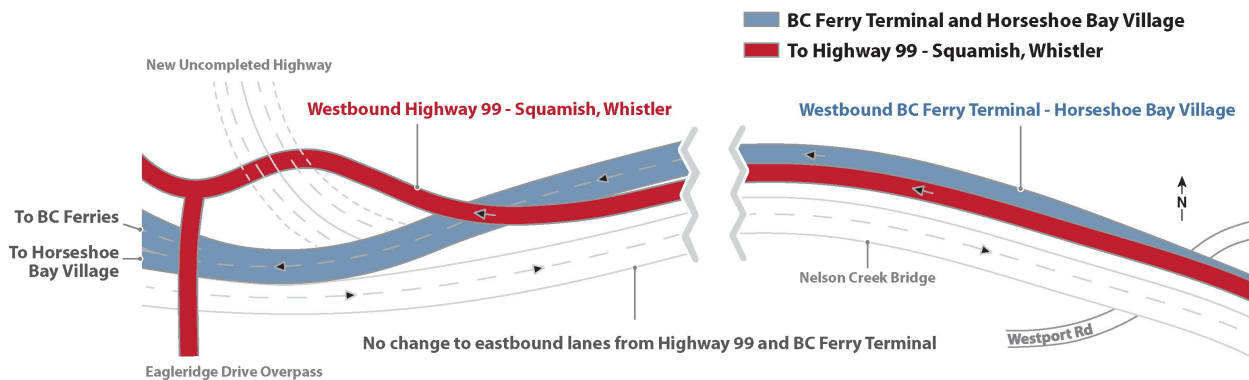

Major new lane-shift approaching Horseshoe Bay at Eagleridge Interchange:

September 12th change affects all northbound traffic to BC Ferries /Horseshoe Bay Village and Sea-to-Sky Highway north

Drivers on Highway 1 (Upper Levels Highway) heading to Horseshoe Bay or the Sea-to-Sky Highway should pay particular attention to a major lane shift in effect as of September 12th at the Eagleridge Interchange in West Vancouver. In order to complete construction at this location, it is necessary to swap the access lanes for both through traffic to Squamish / Whistler and traffic to BC Ferries Terminal and Horseshoe Bay Village.

As illustrated below, traffic to either BC Ferries Terminal or Horseshoe Bay Village now must be in the outside (far right) lane. Travellers to Squamish or Whistler must now position themselves in the left lane. Drivers are urged to negotiate this lane change well before reaching the Horseshoe Bay area, and highway signing will provide direction. As traffic reaches the Caulfeild overpass, drivers should watch for directional signage, and depending upon their destination, move early into the correct lane.



When complete in 2009, this interchange will safely separate traffic going to Squamish or Whistler (Highway 99, The Sea-to-Sky Highway) from local West Vancouver traffic and traffic heading to the BC Ferry Terminal or to Horseshoe Bay Village.
