Temporary traffic pattern change required for paving near Ansell Place

On or about Thursday December 4th, Sea-to-Sky Highway traffic will be re-directed from the current highway onto the Ansell Place exits so that paving can take place on the main highway below. This traffic pattern change is similar to what was in place during major construction at this location.

Hours of work are Monday to Saturday from 7am to 5pm, but if required to complete the work prior to the holidays, crews may need to add evening shifts Monday to Friday from 7pm to 5am.

This traffic pattern change is expected to be in place for up to two weeks. A construction speed zone of 50kph will be implemented through the area while work is carried out.

- Northbound traffic will be directed onto the off-ramp on the east side (Seascapes) and return to the highway via the northern on-ramp.
- Southbound traffic will be directed onto the off-ramp on the west side (Ansell Place) and return the highway via the on-ramp to the south.
- Local traffic across the Ansell Place bridge will be required to stop and give the right-of-way to Sea-to-Sky highway traffic coming from the on-ramps.
