Access maintained at Cleveland and Clarke intersections as paving takes place

Construction crews will begin the next stages of paving at two intersections in Squamish on the Sea-to-Sky Highway Improvement Project beginning at Clarke Drive the week of May 19th, followed by work at Cleveland Avenue the week of May 25th (weather dependent). Milling and paving works will take place over approximately three nights for each intersection

Clarke Drive

- Crews will begin work at the Clarke Drive intersection first. Hours of the night work will be 8pm – 6am. Travellers should watch for electronic message signs for information. Traffic control personnel will be on-site to direct and assist drivers. At no time will the intersection be closed to traffic. Single-lane alternating traffic patterns will be in effect.

Cleveland Avenue

- When work is complete at Clarke Drive, crews will move to the Cleveland Avenue location. Hours of work will be 8pm-6am. Electronic message signs will advise drivers of this work, and traffic control personnel will be at the location to guide drivers. At no time will the intersection be closed to traffic. Single-lane alternating traffic patterns will be in effect.
