Squamish final paving begins in June: Drivers should expect lane shifts and minor delays

Crews will begin final paving in early June through Squamish, between the Stawamus River and Garibaldi Way. This work is temperature and weather dependent, and will be done during the day unless it is warm enough to work at night. With weather and construction-related delays, the work could be underway for much of the month of June.

- **Only minor disruptions during peak travel times are expected (weekends, holidays and 6am-9am and 5pm-8pm weekdays).**

However, travellers through Squamish should expect lane shifts from one side of the highway to the other with minor delays while paving is in progress.

- Pavement transitions from completed sections will be ramped and marked with “bump” signs. People are advised to drive carefully and watch for directional signage and traffic control persons.
- While paving is done through intersections, the signals will be in flash mode and traffic control personnel will direct traffic until all paving processes are complete.
- **Only one side of an intersection will be affected at a time however turning movements may be restricted for up to 6 hours at a time. Watch for electronic signs indicating detours.**
